levated Outdoor is a trend I've seen emerging on the biggest global runways during the past year, spearheaded by the likes of Prada and Miu Miu with many more of our most beloved designers following in their wake.

It's an adaptable trend that leans heavily into utility and performance wear but doesn't require the purchase of new items. Think cargo pants, spray jackets and waterproof outerwear.

Hiking is now high fashion and consumers are ready to climb. Australian brands like Venroy, Jacquemus, and P Jonhson have Elevated Outdoor at the core of their recent collections, with inspiration taken from our national love of outdoor activities like skating and surfing.
